

Language, Literacy and Communication

Retell a favourite part of a familiar story.

Retell through role play familiar stories.

Write fact files about woodland creatures.

Daily incidental Welsh using familiar language patterns.

Read Write Inc. sessions

Descriptive poems about Autumn/The Woods through shared writing.

Homework: Draw a picture of your favourite part of a story set in the woods.

Maths and Numeracy

Number rhymes in song bag

Number of the day - read and write the number, count up to the number and back from the number, place number on a number line- what number comes before and after?

Learn and flash dice patterns as regular warm up

Counting in play.

Numicon in block play

Shop play – coin sorting and paying for items in pennies.

Price items in the role play shop.

Addition and subtraction to 5 – woodland animal number stories. Conkers/leaves on the tree number stories.

Stories of four – animals in the woods, conkers on the tree

Sing the days of the week

Name 2d and 3d shapes

Sort and classify objects using only one criterion – sorting autumn leaves and seeds

Recognise and repeat three object/colour/clapped pattern sequences – creating patterns with autumn objects.

Homework: Make a shop at home..Price your items. Play shops and pay for your items using real 1p coins.

Science and Technology

Trip to Beechenhirst to explore the woodland

Learn about and sort nocturnal and diurnal animals.

Set up hedgehog nesting box and observe for any signs of movement/ use by hedgehogs.

Changing seasons/ signs of Autumn and Winter
Leaf and tree investigations.

Adopt a tree.

Investigate insects that we find in the woods.

Look at birds and their nests.

Create a graph/pictogram using ICT about favourite woodland animals.

Take photographs using an i-pad of our adopted tree and other things we find in the woods .

Internet safety including stranger danger.

Homework: Go for a walk in the woods. Fill a bag with things that you find. Can you find out what each thing is called and where it came from?
