Language, Literacy and Communication

Share a selection of 'growing' themed stories, e.g.:

The enormous turnip and Oliver's Vegetables.

Sharing stories about Luna New Year, St David and St

Dwynwen. Retelling a short story.

Label our body and talk about our organs.

Describing characters from our class stories.

Write instructions to look after a plant.

Write a recipe for meals and snacks we have made with the fruits and vegetables we have grown.

Daily incidental Welsh using familiar language patterns.

Talk about the weather in Welsh. Learn the names of our body parts in Welsh.

Read Write Inc. sessions- Use the phonics we have learnt to segment and blend words. Begin to write sentences about life cycles.

Learn descriptive poems and songs about our bones Them Bones' from 'Funny bones'.

Expressive Arts

Exploring Luna New Year, Dragon's dancing and Lucky Red Envelopes.

Learning how to make a drum to learn Luna New Year drumming songs.

Using clay to make Welsh love spoons.

Learning traditional Welsh songs and Dance.

Creating rain collectors and windmills.

Making collages with natural spring materials

Observational paintings of plants and nature.

Home learning- Make a Dragon from recycled materials at home.

Maths and Numeracy

Recognising and writing numbers to 20 and beyond. Use a number line to count starting from different numbers, forwards and backwards.

Learn and flash dice patterns and finger patterns as regular warm up.

Counting in play and adding groups of vegetables or fruit to find out how many altogether. Addition and subtraction to 10, learning number facts, number stories of 5 and 10.

Comparing size such as our height, find the tallest/shortest person in our role play doctor's surgery.

Shop play – coin sorting and paying for items in pennies and 2ps, pay for vegetables in our garden center role play.

Sort and classify objects using only one criterion – sorting healthy and unhealthy foods.

Recognise and repeat three object/colour/clapped pattern sequences – creating patterns with seeds.
