Science and Technology

- Design a colour-based infographic showing meanings of colours in different countries.
- Simple animation or slideshow explaining how colour helps animals or humans.
- Experiment with mixing coloured light vs mixing paint and comparing the results.
- Explore why objects appear different colours by testing how materials absorb or reflect light.
- Test natural pigments (e.g. beetroot, spinach, turmeric) and compare them with artificial dyes.

Humanities

- Explore how colours in landscapes change around the world (deserts, rainforests, polar regions) and explain why.
- Compare traditional clothing colours from different climates and discuss practical reasons for colour choices.
- Investigate flags of the world, identifying what different colours represent and linking them to geography or history.
- Investigate how ancient civilisations used colour (e.g. Egyptians, Romans, Mayans) and what materials they used.
- Research how colour showed status or power in different societies (e.g. royalty, warriors, religious leaders).
- Explore how colour is used in religious festivals (e.g. Hinduism, Christianity, Islam, Buddhism).

Our Locality

- Interview community members about what colours represent Monmouth to them.
- Carry out a colour audit of a street, park or market area in Monmouth.
- Record findings using photographs, sketches, tally charts or colour wheels.
- Produce a guided walk or leaflet highlighting colour-linked landmarks. (Red- historical/ Blue- geography, etc)



Expressive Arts

- Explore colour symbolism in different cultures and create artwork inspired by one country or region.
- Use traditional patterns from around the world (e.g. African textiles, Aboriginal dot art, Islamic geometric patterns) focusing on colour choice.
- End of year performance- Rock Bottom.

- Discuss how colour choices can show respect or disrespect in different cultures.
- Learn about colour stereotypes and challenge assumptions linked to gender or culture.
